- Use perishable produce quickly.
- Track inventory to prevent over-ordering and spoilage.
- Store all food properly. (Typically below 40 degrees Fahrenheit for refrigerators and 0 degrees Fahrenheit for freezers, consult your local health code requirements.)
- Keep your storage equipment in good working order.
- Prepare for power loss by having a back up power plan.

You won't be sued for donating leftover food. The Bill Emerson Good Samaritan Food Donation Act protects from civil and criminal liability should a recipient get ill or hurt as a result of consumed donated food. Donors are only culpable in cases of gross negligence or intentional misconduct.

SENATE BILL 1383 EFFECTIVE JANUARY 2022

What Does This New Law Mean for My Business?

- All sites must have **compost** and **recycling** collection service. Contact LSI at 925-583-3517 to start or improve your recycling and composting!
- **Compost** and **recycling** bins must be placed next to all garbage bins, including indoors, except in restrooms. Items must also be properly sorted into the bins.
- Free help and indoor compost bins are available.

AVOID CONTAMINATION!

Styrofoam®, plastic film/wrap, and plastic packaging belongs in your Garbage container.

PLEASE NOTE: Only plastic bottles, jars, and tubs labeled 1-7 go into the blue **Recyclables** cart.

KEEP IT CLEAN! Empty and rinse or wipe recyclable containers.

MAKE THE MOST OF YOUR SPACE! Flatten boxes before placing in the **Recyclables** cart or bin.

Proper Sorting Makes a Difference!

USE YOUR CONTAINERS TO SORT YOUR WASTE FOR:

- Compliance with California regulations: AB341, AB1826, and SB1383. Visit www.stopwaste.org/rules for more info.
- A reduction in disposal. Of the 39 million tons of waste disposed of in California landfills in 2018, one third was compostable organic materials.
- A reduction in greenhouse gas emissions. Organic materials in landfills produce methane, a greenhouse gas that contributes to pollution and global warming. Composting sequesters carbon and reduces greenhouse gas emissions.

DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS WASTE RESPONSIBLY Hazardous Waste Drop-in Program for Businesses

Hazardous waste does NOT belong in your **Recyclables**, **Organics**, or **Garbage** containers. Alameda County operates a Hazardous Waste Business Drop-in Program. Accepted materials include: latex paint, aerosol cans, fluorescent lamps, and batteries. A form is required and charges apply.
